Qualifications: Applicants must have a completed doctoral degree in socio-cultural anthropology at time of appointment. Topical specializations are open but should complement those of existing faculty within our combined department. Candidates must have interests in international and global issues and processes and expertise in a geographical area not covered by current faculty. Teaching experience is required. Experience with and an interest in developing interdisciplinary programs at Marshall University is highly desired.

Duties: Primary responsibilities include a) teaching core and elective courses in the Department's undergraduate anthropology major and the anthropology Area of Emphasis with the Department's master's degree in sociology; the core courses include Cultural Anthropology, Theory in Ethnology, and Junior Seminar (a professional development course); elective courses will include classes in the successful candidates area of specialization; b) contributing to the University's general education curriculum, with its emphasis on a common First Year Seminar and core courses that enhance students' critical thinking; c) maintaining an active program of research; and d) service activities.
