A suggested semester-by-semester plan

Reminders

- 120 credit hours of 100 to 499 level courses
- earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better
- 37 credit hours of art core classes

- earn a "C" or better in English 201 and in all required
- 6 hours of critical thinking
