The Center for the Advancement of Teaching and Learning is pleased to offer the **Hedrick Grants for Teaching Innovation**. These grants, provided by Charles and Mary Jo Hedrick, provide funds to departments and programs for the improvement of instruction through innovative teaching. The award is \$5,000.00 and proposals are due in early April.

Examples of teaching innovations include, but are not limited to:

- ❖ Teaching strategies that encourage student / teacher interaction
- ❖ Classroom research or experimental learning projects
- ❖ Student engagement in the community
- ❖ New approaches to evaluating student performance and learning outcomes
- ❖ Problem-based learning, case study methods, etc.

Applications are evaluated by a blind review process. Evaluation criteria include:

- ❖ Innovation
- ❖ Program-Wide Impact
- ❖ Clarity of Purpose & Procedures
- ❖ Appropriateness of Evaluation Methods
- ❖ Feasibility of Time-Line & Budget
- ❖ Potential for Dissemination of the Project
- ❖ Potential impact of Project Outcomes on Many Students
