### **Dr. Teresa Eagle: COEPD Updates**

- TPAs
  1. Fall 2015 – COEPD Student Teachers participated in a TPA.
    - Secondary students completed the edTPA
    - Elementary students completed the PPAT
  2. Modifications are being made to ensure student success.
  3. Spring 2016 – The plan is to continue with what we did for Fall 2015 as far as TPAs.
  4. The Dean would like to see more faculty members to become national scorers.
  5. Allison Carey requested information on the edTPA; Tina Allen offered to provide it to her.
- Program Updates
  1. CAEP Review will be held in 2018.
  2. SPAs must be passed in advance.
  3. Praxis/PLT pass rates are under scrutiny.
- Jenkins Hall

Tentative plan for major renovations to Jenkins Hall planned for June 2016.

### **Dr. Edna Meisel: Assessment Updates**

- Data Needs
  1. Praxis success, SPA reports, six specific key assessments.
  2. Ken O'Connor asked for information on Praxis pass rates to see where the issues may be with Chemistry Education majors.
  3. Low Praxis pass rates for Math. Dr. Lucas said that 80% of the material covered in CI 201 is on the new Praxis exam. However, several majors are not required to take CI 201; for majors such as English, Art, etc. we could possibly offer a tutorial session.
  4. IF a tutorial session was given, we will need to communicate that information to other buildings (besides Jenkins Hall) to reach more students.
  5. Dr. Mitchell requested information from Dr. Lucas to see if MTH 121 needs to change to meet with needs of the Praxis math exam.
  6. In January, Edna Meisel will send out meeting dates to discuss needs within each content area.

## **Ms. Kandice Napier: Advising Updates**

- Curriculum Sheets Updates
  1. Updated curriculum sheets were handed out to various departments.
  2. Kandice requested all changes and updates be reported as soon as possible to ensure correct advising.
- Double Major/Dual Degree Form
  1. Kandice discussed the difference between a double major and a dual degree and introduced the new form the SCOPES office will be using.
- Candidate Selectivity – Undergraduate Admission Interview Proposal
  1. Dr. Isaacs would like to create an ad-hoc committee to discuss the implementation of an interview process prior to admission into teacher education.
  2. The committee will discuss issues that include:
    - ◆ What happens if a student does not pass the interview?
    - ◆ What type of remediation will be put into place?
  3. Rob Wray volunteered to serve of this committee.
- Teacher-In-Residence Program
  1. The following counties have a TIR in approved and in place: Boone, Mason, Mingo and Putnam.
  2. Kanawha and Wirt Counties have both applied for a TIR and is awaiting approval from the WVDE.
  3. We are discussing the possibility of a TIR with both Cabell and Wayne County.
- Secondary Methods for MAT Students
  1. There will be a content specific workshop held on February 27, 2016. Allison Carey and Karen Mitchell agreed to volunteer and work with the MAT students on methods.
