- ✚ upon completion of their B.A. degrees, members are eligible to apply for a scholarship either to the Summer Session of the American Academy in Rome, Italy, which provides educational tours of Italy and the Aegean, or
- ✚ to the Summer Session of the American School of Classical Studies in Athens, Greece, which provides educational tours of Greece, the Aegean, and Crete.
- ✚ These scholarships pay for tuition and travel expenses for six to eight weeks of summer travel and study.
- ✚ Students who are finishing the second semester of beginning Latin or Greek, have had one Classics (CL) class, and have at least a 3.0 average in all Latin, Greek, and Classics classes are invited to join.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH A MAJOR IN LATIN?

Degrees in Latin provide a broad base of **knowledge** and **intellectual skills** that enable people to be **flexible** and **versatile** in a constantly changing job environment. In particular these degrees provide:

- **Language expertise** that may lead to the **study** and **teaching** of Latin, Greek and Romance Languages such as Spanish and French in public and private schools as well as at the college and university level.
- A solid basis for **graduate training** in law and medicine;
- Preparation for occupations in and connected with **Classical Archaeology** which include
field archaeology (involving additional skills in photography, drafting, or surveying),
materials conservation (the preservation of antiquities that have been recovered),
museum work (where interest and education in art history are valuable), and
the **travel and tourist industry** (planning and conducting tours through classical countries like Italy, Greece, and Turkey);
- A basis for work in various **public service agencies** where there has been a long tradition of people with a classical education.
