<b>English Composition Requirement (6 Hours)</b>	<b>Dept. #</b>	<b>Hrs.</b>
ENG 101 & 102 (Jr. & Sr. 302) or ENG 201H must be taken for the requirement. (ACT of 0-17=ENL 095; 18-27=ENG 101; 28-33=ENG 201H; 34-36= Credit for ENG 101- 102. <b>Foreign Language Requirement (12 Hours)</b>	<b>Dept. #</b>	<b>Hrs.</b>
Successful completion of 12 hour sequence ending with ARB 204; CHN 204; FRN 204; GER 204; GRK 302; JPN 204; LAT 204; MDL 204; or SPN 204. Students must complete the sequence beginning with the first course they take. Students with at least 2 years of high school Spanish or French can begin with SPN 112 or FRN 112 for which they will receive 6 hours of credit (for FRN 101 or SPN 101) if they earn at least a C. The next course in the sequence would then be Spanish 203 or French 203. Up to 3 semesters may be waived by the Modern Language Department for language taken in high school. This requirement also may be waived through conclusive proof of native proficiency of a foreign language and its culture.		
<b>Communication Studies Requirement (3 Hours)</b>	<b>Dept. #</b>	<b>Hrs.</b>
CMM 103 or CMM 104H must be taken to fulfill this requirement. This requirement may be waived by the Communication Studies Dept. if high school speech was taken and the student passes the proficiency examination.
