In collaboration with the Department of Integrated Science and Technology, we also offer students the opportunity to **minor in Cybercrime and Digital Evidence Retrieval/Recovery**. Our department was founded in 1974 and was among the first in the state of West Virginia to offer degrees in the field. We offer B.A. and M.S. degrees.

## STUDY ABROAD OPPORTUNITIES

We offer short-term study abroad courses to Europe (**England, France, Ireland and Northern Ireland**, with plans to include Spain, Italy, and Germany in the future). On these trips, we visit police agencies, observe court proceedings, and tour prisons to learn about how other countries approach the crime
