Advising Tips

1. Graduation

You must complete 128 hours in order to graduate and 48 of these must be taken at the 300-400 level. Courses with a course number that begins with a 0 do not count toward graduation.

2. D/F Repeat Rule

Courses taken before 60 attempted hours may be repeated and the new grade substituted if retaken before graduation. The COLA Office must be notified of the course when it is retaken.

3. Academic Support Center

(located on the lower level of the Community and Technical College building). Individual, drop in and group tutoring for classes.

5. Credit Evaluation

After completing 70 hours, you should call the College of Liberal Arts office and make an appointment for a Credit Evaluation by the COLA Academic Advisor (696-2350).

The College Academic Advisor will review your academic record and complete a form with the remaining requirements you must fulfill to graduate. You also should have your evaluation checked again when you become a senior.

Before you begin your final semester, you should pay your graduation fee at the Bursar's Office (Old Main 101), and then take a copy of your receipt to the College of Liberal Arts Office in Old Main 107. The College Academic Advisor will then do a final check of all of the classes you have taken and are proposing to ensure that you will graduate.

Foreign Language Requirement (12 Hours)	Course	Hrs
Successful completion of 12 hour sequence ending with ARB 204; FRN 204; GER 204; GRK 302; JPN 204; LAT 204; MDL 204; PRT 204; or SPN 204. Students must complete the sequence beginning with the first course they take. Students with at least 2 years of high school Spanish or French can begin with SPN 112 or FRN 112 for which they will receive 6 hours of credit (for FRN 101 or SPN 101) if they earn at least a C. The next course in the sequence would then be Spanish 203 or French 203. Up to 3 semesters may be waived by the Modern Language Department for language taken in high school. This requirement also may be waived through conclusive proof of native proficiency of a foreign language and its culture.		
Communication Studies Requirement (3 Hours)	Course	Hrs
CMM 103 or CMM 104H must be taken to fulfill this requirement. This requirement may be waived by the Communication Studies Dept. if high school speech was taken and the student passes the proficiency examination.

Hours taken from: CL 230, 231, 232, 233, 234, 235, or 236; Any ENG 300 or 400 level literature course; RST 304, 310, 320, 325, or 351; LAT any 300 or 400 level course; any 300 or 400 level literature in FRN, GER, or SPN.		
Social Science Requirement (15 Hours)	Course	Hrs
Courses must be taken from at least three fields. Any Criminal Justice; Economics; Geography: GEO 100, 203, 206, 302, 305, 309, 315, 317, 320, 401, 403, 405, 408, 410, 412, 420; History; Political Science; Psychology; Sociology/Anthropology (except SOC 108); or Women's Studies: WS 101.		
Mathematics Requirement (3 Hours)	Course	Hrs
MTH 121 or higher. (ACT 1-11=MAT 080; ACT of 12-15=MAT 085; 16-18=MAT 095; 19=MTH 121. MAT 080, 085, and 095 do not count toward the 128 hours needed for graduation.

Computer Literacy to be acquired in English composition classes. Computer competency for English major from e-portfolio.
