# Alumni Legacy Tuition Reduction for Metro Students

- Provides a tuition scholarship waiver to offset the cost of the Metro Tuition Rate to that of the WV Resident Tuition Rate to first-time freshmen whose parent or grandparent graduated from Marshall University.
- Eligibility Criteria
  - H.S. GPA of 3.5 or higher
  - ACT composite score of 26 or higher (or SAT CR + M 1170 or higher)

# Alumni Legacy Tuition Reduction for Non-resident Students

- Provides a tuition scholarship waiver to first-time freshmen whose parent or grandparent graduated from Marshall University.
- Tier 1 Eligibility Criteria (award amount is difference between NR & WV tuition rates, approximately \$8,000)
  - ACT composite score of 26 or higher (or SAT CR + M 1170 or higher) and a H.S. GPA of at least 3.5
- Tier 2 Eligibility Criteria (award amount is difference between NR and Metro rates, approximately \$3,690)
  - ACT composite score of 23 or higher (or SAT CR + M 1050 or higher) and a H.S. GPA of at least 2.75

# Need-based Awarding for Metro Students: Achievement

- Receives a tuition waiver that covers 55% of the student's demonstrated need after all other federal, state, institutional grant, scholarships, and loans are awarded
  - Criteria: Pell eligible, High School Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher, and ACT composite score of 21 or higher (or SAT CR + M of 990 or higher)
  - Student must live on campus to receive this award

# Need-based Awarding for Non-resident Students: Achievement


- Non-resident Tier 1 (Receives a tuition waiver that covers 60% of the student's demonstrated need after all other federal, state, institutional grants, scholarships, and loans are awarded).
  - Criteria: Pell eligible, High School Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher, ACT composite score of 21 or higher (or SAT CR + M of 990 or higher), and live on campus
- Non-resident Tier 2 (Receives a tuition waiver that covers 50% of the student's demonstrated need after all other federal, state, institutional grants, scholarships, and loans are awarded).
  - Criteria: Pell eligible, High School Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher, ACT composite score of 16 – 20 (or SAT CR + M of 780 – 980) and High School Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher **or** ACT composite score of 21 or higher (or SAT CR + M of 990 or higher) and High School Grade Point Average between 2.5 – 2.99, and live on campus

# Need-based Awarding for Metro & Non-resident Students: Opportunity Grant


- Receives a tuition waiver grant in the amount of \$1,000
- Criteria
  - File FAFSA by March 1, 2015
  - High School GPA < 3.0 or ACT < 22 (SAT CR + Math < 1020)
  - Ineligible for Pell and EFC < 19,500
  - Demonstrate financial need > \$1,000
