**The difference between MC and INTL Courses (Draft: 11/15/2012)**

There are several common characteristics between International and Multicultural courses, and thus when an instructor wishes to apply for the “INTL” or “MC” attribute to be applied to a course they teach, it can be challenging to determine which of the two designations should be sought.

In the table below, the General Education Council provides its understanding of some of the key differences between International and Multicultural courses. This information is provided in hopes that it may help guide instructors in knowing which designation to apply for, and in better understanding which characteristics should be demonstrated in the syllabi and course application materials that are provided to the General Education Council.

<b>Characteristic</b>	<b>International</b>	<b>Multicultural</b>
Time	At least 50% of content <i>must</i> focus on the <b>current</b> <sup>1</sup> world	Content <i>may</i> include the <b>past and/or present</b> cultures
Location	At least 50% of content <i>must</i> cover topics <b>beyond</b> US borders	Coverage <i>may</i> include cultures <b>within</b> the US.
Focus	<i>May</i> focus on a <b>single</b> region / country	<i>Must</i> include <b>multiple</b> cultures beyond students’ own

<sup>1</sup>Note: the definition of the “current world” is not explicitly defined, since it may vary by country, region, or issue. For example, in Norway ‘the current world’ might be since 1905, when Norway became independent of Sweden. By contrast, in the United Arab Emirates, ‘the current world’ might be since 1971, when the country was founded.
