A transfer of copyright will be required for each article accepted for publication in the *Journal of Rural Community Psychology*.

All manuscripts should be typed, double-spaced, and follow the format of the *Publication Manual* of the American Psychological Association (2nd Edition). A 125-175 word abstract should accompany each manuscript.
