Reading with your child is an excellent way to expose your child to words, topics, and ideas that are more complex than what they would see in books they can read on their own.

## **Activities**

- » **Before Reading**: Take a picture walk through the book and point out the different themes of each page. Try to make connections to your child's experience by commenting on objects they know like "there's a van, just like our van."
- » **During Reading**: Point to the pictures and say the name of the object. If you are fluent enough in Spanish say the name is Spanish as well.
- » After Reading: Allow your child to revisit pages that they like the best. Say the name of objects and encourage your child to repeat you. Practice wait-time!
- » **Object Match**: Gather several toys or real objects that you see in the book. When you get to that page point to the object in the book and the "real" object to make a connection for your child.

- » **Learn Together**: Practice Spanish together as a family. Label common items in your house with both the English and Spanish words so that the whole family can support each other.
