Re: Early Admit for the BSN Program

High school seniors have an opportunity to get admitted into the Marshall University BSN program before they graduate high school. If they are interested in applying to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing program they will need to complete a Marshall University application and the application for the BSN program. Both applications must be completed by the application deadline of January 15th of their senior year. After January 15th a student is considered a college student and will have a different application process based on a point system. The Point System Handout explains how this system works and is available at www.marshall.edu/cohp.

Admission to this program is determined on a competitive basis. High school seniors must have a minimum ACT composite of 21 to apply to this program.

Please Note: With an ACT composite of 24 or higher, applicants will receive an automatic admit into the freshman class. High school seniors will also need to have a high school grade point average of 2.5, based on a 4.0 system, or higher (calculated on courses completed by the end of their junior year).

If the high school senior does not meet the direct admit into the BSN program they still may apply to the program during their college freshman year. Admission to the BSN program must be made by January 15th, whether they apply as a college freshman or high school senior for the next fall term. Please keep in mind that there is no automatic admit as a college freshman into the BSN program.
