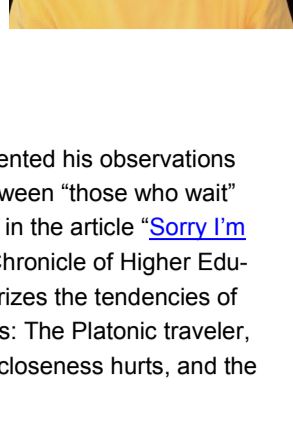

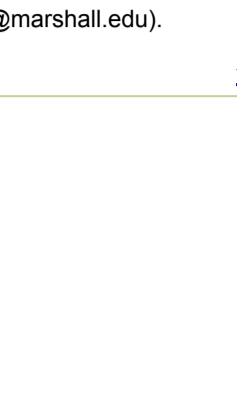

Meet the New Faculty: Dr. Jung Han Kim

Dr. Jung Han Kim is a new Associate Professor in the Department of Pharmacology, Physiology, and Toxicology at the Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine. Prior to coming to Marshall, Dr. Kim was an Assistant Professor of Nutrition at the University of Tennessee. Her research examines the molecular basis of an obesity susceptibility gene, *fabw2*, derived from the TAL-LYHO mouse model. This model may lead to the discovery of cellular regulatory pathways to control obesity. [More...](#)
