Faculty need to take copyright law very seriously when designing online or traditional courses at Marshall University. When it comes to copyright law, faculty and staff may be *personally* liable for fines or criminal charges. **Ignorance of the law is no excuse. If you don't know that you are infringing, you still will be liable for damages - only the amount of the award will be affected.** Copyright owners have the right to sue for damages for information or intellectual property of theirs that is used without their permission. The penalties for infringement are very harsh; the court can award up to \$150,000 for each separate act of willful infringement.
