PLAN OF STUDY

The MSN-NM program can be completed in two and half academic years of full-time study, or over a period not to exceed 7 calendar years from date of first class enrollment. The student must complete the first 25 credit hours of study at Marshall University; then transfer to Shenandoah University to complete the remaining 19 credit hours of specialty nurse midwifery courses. The NM student has up to seven years from the point of admission to complete the MSN-NM area of emphasis. Graduate nursing courses, except NUR 620, 621, 622, 663 & 664, for Nurses in Advanced Practice, courses are open only to those students admitted to the nursing program.
