



## SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

### *W.B. “Bart” and Doris Andrews Scholarship for the School of Pharmacy*

1. The Marshall University Foundation, Inc. has established an endowed fund known as the *W.B. “Bart” and Doris Andrews Scholarship for the School of Pharmacy*.
2. The income, determined by the spending policy established by The Marshall University Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors, shall support this annual award. The fund will be managed in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as adopted by the State of West Virginia. Additional contributions may be added to this fund at any time.
3. The W.B. “Bart” and Doris Andrews Scholarship for the School of Pharmacy will consist of a 3,000-dollar scholarship annually.
4. The recipient(s) shall be enrolled as a full-time student in Marshall University School of Pharmacy. The Candidate will be evaluated based on the following criteria:
  - a. P2-P4 Status
  - b. West Virginia Resident
  - c. Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) equal to or greater than 3.0
  - d. Academic and professional in good standing
  - e. Essay (500 – 1000 words): Provide an essay on your involvement within activities, Committees’, community service within Marshall University School of Pharmacy (i.e. senior fest, donating time to school, organizations)
5. The student awarded the W.B. “Bart” and Doris Andrews Scholarship will receive this award yearly for the P2 – P4 years of pharmacy school as long as criteria identified above is maintained.
6. The Marshall University Foundation Inc. accepts funds in which the recipients will not be based solely on any of the following criteria unless University policy dictates otherwise: race, gender, religion, handicap or national origin.
7. Should the purpose for this fund no longer exist at Marshall University, or changes in the law impact the tax-exempt status of the Foundation, the Board of Directors of the Foundation may designate a purpose most consistent with the original intent of the donor.
