Marshall University School of Pharmacy Leadership Scholarship

1. The Marshall University School of Pharmacy has established an endowed fund known as the *Marshall University School of Pharmacy Leadership Scholarship Award*
2. The income, determined by the spending policy established by The Marshall University Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors, shall support this annual award. The fund will be managed in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as adopted by the State of West Virginia. Additional contributions may be added at any time.
3. The Marshall University School of Pharmacy Leadership Scholarship will consist of a financial award; the amount to be determined annually.
4. Submission Deadline is March 1st.
5. The recipient(s) shall be enrolled as a full-time student in the Marshall University School of Pharmacy. The candidate will be evaluated based on the following criteria
 - a. P2-P4 Status
 - b. Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) equal to or greater than 3.0
 - c. Academically and professionally in good standing
 - d. Within the past year demonstrated leadership such as professional organization, student organization, student government, and/or other activities.
 - e. Essay (500 – 1000 words) describing your thoughts on importance of leadership in the profession of pharmacy. Please include examples within the past year of you demonstrating leadership such as professional organization, student organization, student government, and/or other activities.
6. The Marshall University School of Pharmacy Students Affairs, Awards and Scholarship Committee accepts funds where selection of recipients is not based solely on any of the following criteria unless University policy dictates otherwise: race, gender, religion, handicap or national origin.
7. Should the purpose for this fund no longer exist at Marshall University School of Pharmacy, Student Affairs, Awards and Scholarship Committee may designate a purpose most consistent with the original intent of the donor.
