

Pharmacy Professional Development Scholarship

Criteria

- 1. The Marshall University School of Pharmacy has established an endowed fund known as the *Pharmacy Professional Development Scholarship*. This scholarship's purpose is to help promote pharmaceutical research and participation in professional pharmacy organizations.
- 2. The income, determined by the spending policy established by The Marshall University school of Pharmacy Student Affairs, Awards and Scholarship Committee, shall support this annual award through the endowed fund. The fund will be managed in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA) as adopted by the State of West Virginia. Additional contributions may be added at any time.
- 3. The Pharmacy Professional Development Scholarship will consist of a financial award; the amount to be determined annually.
- 4. The recipient(s) shall be a full-time student in the Marshall University School of Pharmacy. The candidate will be evaluated based on the following criteria for the previous academic year
 - a. P3-P4 students
 - b. Successful completion of all required courses
 - c. In good professional and academic standing
 - d. Participates in pharmacy research
 - e. Active in one or more professional pharmacy organizations
 - f. Recommendation from research advisor
 - g. Essay (500 1000 words) Describing your involvement in research at Marshall University School of Pharmacy and your plans for future research through post graduate training PhD, pharmacy residency or fellowship.
- 5. The Dean of the School of Pharmacy or his/her designee shall select the recipient in cooperation with the Office of Student Assistance.
- 6. The Marshall University School of Pharmacy Students Affairs, Awards and Scholarship Committee accepts funds where selection of recipients is not based solely on any of the following criteria unless University policy dictates otherwise: race, gender, religion, handicap or national origin.
- 7. Should the purpose for this fund no longer exist at Marshall University School of Pharmacy, Student Affairs, Awards and Scholarship Committee may designate a purpose most consistent with the original intent of the donor.
