Mission

Student assessment is measured across several dimensions of the DPT program including general knowledge and skills, physical therapy evaluation, clinical reasoning ability, professional behaviors, and the ability to function effectively in clinical practice. Multiple outcome tools that include mock board examinations, NPTE scores, One-Year Graduate Surveys, Clinical Performance Instrument (CPI), and Employer Surveys are used to triangulate overall student and program performance. The Student Assessment Matrix outlines the desired student outcomes, the assessment methods, established benchmarks, and the available results for available cohorts.
