Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS)

The BAS program affords students that have completed an Associates of Applied Science degree at a regionally accredited institution, such as a community and technical college, an opportunity to pursue a baccalaureate degree to advance their professional credentials.

ADMISSION—The student must:

- Have earned an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree from a regionally accredited institution
- Meet all general Marshall University admission requirements

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS SUMMARY:

- Total credits - 120 semester hours
- Area of Emphasis (AOE) - 24 semester hours (minimum)
- Upper Division (300/400 level courses - 40 semester hours)
- General Education - 42 semester hours (including applicable AAS General Education hours). Courses must be distributed among all of the following categories:

Communications	6 semester hours
Natural Sciences	3 semester hours
Mathematics	3 semester hours
Computer/Information Technology	3 semester hours
Social Science/Humanities/Fine Arts	6 semester hours
Additional approved credit from any of the above categories	<u>21</u> semester hours

AREA OF EMPHASIS REQUIREMENT (AOE) - 24 Semester Hours:

- Areas of Emphasis are defined program concentrations consisting of 24 semester hours (minimum).
- The student must complete the AOE coursework with a minimum grade of “C” in each course.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT - 24 SEMESTER HOURS TAKEN THROUGH MARSHALL UNIVERSITY

FLEXIBLE WAYS TO EARN CREDIT:

- Traditional classes at multiple locations
- Technology delivered courses - e.g. Online or Interactive TV
- Credit by Examination - e.g. College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST)
- Credit earned as an approved transient student at other institutions

TRANSFER CREDIT

- In transferring credits from other regionally accredited institutions of higher learning to the BAS degree program, all passing grades are accepted.
- CLEP / DSST and results of similar test are accepted.
- Transfer credits are assessed for purposes of meeting upper- and lower-division requirements when admitted to program.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

Get admitted. Current Marshall students only have to initiate an inter-college transfer request to move from the Marshall Community & Technical College or other current MU college to Marshall University School of Extended Education (SEE). If you are not a Marshall student you must:

- Submit an Admissions Application with appropriate fees (Admissions Application Fee - \$30 / Transfer Evaluation Fee - \$50) to: Marshall University, ATTN: Admissions, One John Marshall Drive, Huntington, WV 25755
- Request Official Transcripts from any colleges/universities attended to be sent directly to Marshall University Admissions
