Mission Statement

The Marshall University Faculty Senate was established June 1, 1987 as a result of a majority vote of the faculty. The body is composed of proportional representation from the following units -- as the College of Education, the College of Fine Arts, the Graduate School of Education & Professional Development, the College of Health Professions, the College of Information Technology & Engineering, the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Science, the Elizabeth McDowell Lewis College of Business, the Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine, the W. Page Pitt School of Journalism & Mass Communications, the Marshall University Libraries, and one At-Large Senator from the South Charleston campus. Senators are elected at large from each of these units to two-year terms.

Much of the preliminary work of the Faculty Senate is managed in the Standing Committees and the Graduate Council which report to the Faculty Senate and whose actions (with certain exceptions) are subject to final review, modification, and approval by the full Faculty Senate.
