TEACH Grant Application

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant is awarded by Marshall University to students who are completing, or intend to complete, coursework to begin a career in teaching and who agree to serve for a minimum of four years as a full-time, highly-qualified, high-need field teach in a low-income school.

If students awarded the TEACH Grant do not complete the four years of qualified teaching service within eight years of completing the course of study for which the TEACH Grant was received, or otherwise fail to meet any other requirement of the TEACH Grant, the Grant will convert into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement.

The U.S. Department of Education provides the funding for this program. Eligible full-time students may receive up to \$4,000 per year in TEACH Grant funds, up to a maximum of \$16,000 for undergraduate and \$8,000 for graduate study. Post-baccalaureate students enrolled at Marshall University do not qualify for this program.

To qualify for a TEACH Grant, Marshall University students must:

- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (<u>FAFSA</u>) at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> for the academic year the student wishes to receive the TEACH Grant. (Please note that TEACH Grant is not based on financial need).
- 2. Meet certain academic achievement requirements:

Incoming freshmen

Have a high school cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher or Have scored above the 75th percentile on at least one battery of a nationally normed admission test (Such as SAT or ACT)

Incoming transfers

Have a transferable cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher or Have scored above the 75th percentile on at least one battery of a nationally normed admission test (Such as SAT or ACT)

- Current Marshall undergraduates Have a cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher or Have scored above the 75th percentile on at least one battery of a nationally normed admission test (Such as SAT or ACT)
- Incoming Master's level students

Have an undergraduate cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher or Have scored above the 75th percentile on at least one battery of a nationally normed admission test (Such as SAT or ACT)

- Current Marshall Master's level students
 Have a cumulative college grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or higher or
 Have scored above the 75th percentile on at least one battery of a nationally normed
 admission test (Such as SAT or ACT)
- 3. Enroll in coursework necessary to complete a teach certification in a high-need field.
- 4. Complete the Marshall University TEACH Grant Application.
- 5. Submit the Marshall University TEACH Grant Academic Advisor Form.
- 6. Complete TEACH Grant Entrance Counseling.
- 7. Complete an Agreement to Serve (<u>ATS</u>) from the U.S. Department of Education at <u>https://teach-ats.ed.gov/ats/index.action</u>.

I understand that if have not scored above the 75th percentile on a nationally recognized admissions test, I must maintain a 3.25 GPA to continue to receive TEACH in subsequent academic years.

- I understand that this grant is intended only for students who plan to become teachers in a high-need subject field and who plan to teach in low-income schools as determined by the federal government or state which is subject to change.
- I understand that I must apply annually, complete TEACH Grant Counseling, submit a completed TEACH Grant Advisor Form and sign an Agreement to Serve (<u>ATS</u>) each year that I am eligible.
- I understand that if I am not able to meet the conditions outlined in the Agreement to Serve the TEACH Grant will convert to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, and the interest will be backdated to the time of the grant disbursement.
- I understand that in order to keep the grant from becoming a loan, I must teach four of the eight years following the completion of my program in a high-need subject area and in a low-income school regardless of the number of years I received the grant.

By signing this form, I am certifying that I have read this form and all enclosures thoroughly. I understand that by signing and submitting this form, I am requesting the Marshall University Office of Student Assistance determine my eligibility for the TEACH Grant and, if it is determined that I am eligible, to add the grant to my award package. (Note: the TEACH Grant Application – Academic Advisor Section must be attached with this application).
