A RESOLUTION

1. To urge changes to university policy regarding outside food

- (a). Whereas, Marshall University boasts over two hundred student organizations of all sizes;
- (b). Whereas, it is Student Government’s duty to ensure that all organizations have an equal opportunity at success;
- (c). Whereas, current regulations prevent student organizations from serving food on campus that is not supplied by Sodexo;
- (d). Whereas, it is a common complaint from student organizations that Sodexo charges an excessive amount for catering and therefore hurts some organizations’ ability to host effective events;
- (e). Whereas, all student organizations suffer when they are given limited options and inflated prices;
- (f). Whereas, especially smaller organizations bear the burden of said regulations;
- (g). Therefore, be it resolved that Marshall University and Sodexo loosen their regulations on bringing in outside food for student organizations’ events on campus.
