On-Line Access and Digitization: From May to September of 2008, the scenic postcards and a small selection of the holiday and greeting postcards were digitized. As of the time of the writing of this document, there are links from Marshall's library home page (www.marshall.edu/library) to two small virtual on-line exhibits of samples of the postmarks and holiday postcards. The 318 scenes that were digitized represent 124 West Virginia towns and villages, and an additional 12 holiday and greeting postcards were also digitized.

This collection was a gift from Mrs. Harriett Caverlee, widow of Mr. Caverlee in 1994.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE COLLECTION

The collection consists of two boxes containing 12 three-ring notebooks, a third box containing file folders of postmarks and envelopes from states other than West Virginia, also two scrapbooks containing other postmarked envelopes. The bulk of the collection consists of 12 three-ring notebooks containing postmarks and postcards of West Virginia towns and post offices. These notebooks are organized by West Virginia county. Many of the postmarks are on the complete, original envelope, but many have been cut off the envelopes. The postcards fall into three classes: plain blank postcards with just a postmark, holiday or greeting postcards, and the scenic views of West Virginia, which are the majority of the postcards. Many of the postcard scenes and postmarks are from post offices that no longer exist.

Carl Clifford Caverlee
1909 – 1988

C. Clifford Caverlee was born June 11, 1909 at McKeesport, Pa., the son of Carl Benton Caverlee and Margaret Cartmill Caverlee. By the time of the 1920 census, the family had moved to Huntington, W.Va. where Carl Benton found employment as a coach carpenter. In the 1930 census, the family was living on 9th Avenue in Huntington, and Carl Benton was a carpenter for

the railroad, probably the Chesapeake & Ohio (C&O.) Later that year, C. Clifford entered Marshall College (now Marshall University) and received an A. B. degree in 1932. By that time, C. Clifford had chosen his path to the ministry. He then attended the Southern Baptist Seminary and the American Baptist Seminary in Louisville, Ky., where he received his Master's Degree in Theology in 1935. He later married Henrietta Sadler, and they had one son, Clifford Robert Caverlee. C. Clifford became a prominent Baptist minister in W.Va. By the mid -1950's he was the executive secretary of the W.Va. State Baptist Convention, a position he held for several years. By 1965 he had spent several years as the head of evangelism for the Baptist Convention. Around 1970, Caverlee became interested in the postal history of W.Va. and began collecting postmarks and postcards. According to an article in the *Charleston Gazette* of Aug. 4, 1980, his collection at that time consisted of over 1,750 different postmarks from cities and towns of the Mountain State. At that point, he began to concentrate his collecting activities on post offices that had closed prior to that date. His favorite postal story related in that article was when several citizens in Lincoln County wanted a post office for their little town, so they sent their petition to the Postal Service with the words across the top: "We want a post office." The result was that their post office was granted, and named "Wewanta." The article related that he scoured antique stores and flea markets looking for the old postcards. The 1970's and early 80's appear to be the height of his collecting, as many of the postmarks he obtained from the small-town post offices bear dates in that range. Several of the postcards he acquired bear postmark dates back to the 1890's. Part of his vast collection consists of zip code directories and post office lists for W.Va., which he used to complete his collection. For the last several years of his life, the family resided at 1275 Huntington Ave. C. Clifford Caverlee passed away on Aug. 23, 1988, at Cabell Huntington Hospital. He was entombed at Ridgelawn Park Abbey of Devotion in Huntington. In November of 1994, his widow, Henrietta, donated his collection to Marshall University Special Collections.
