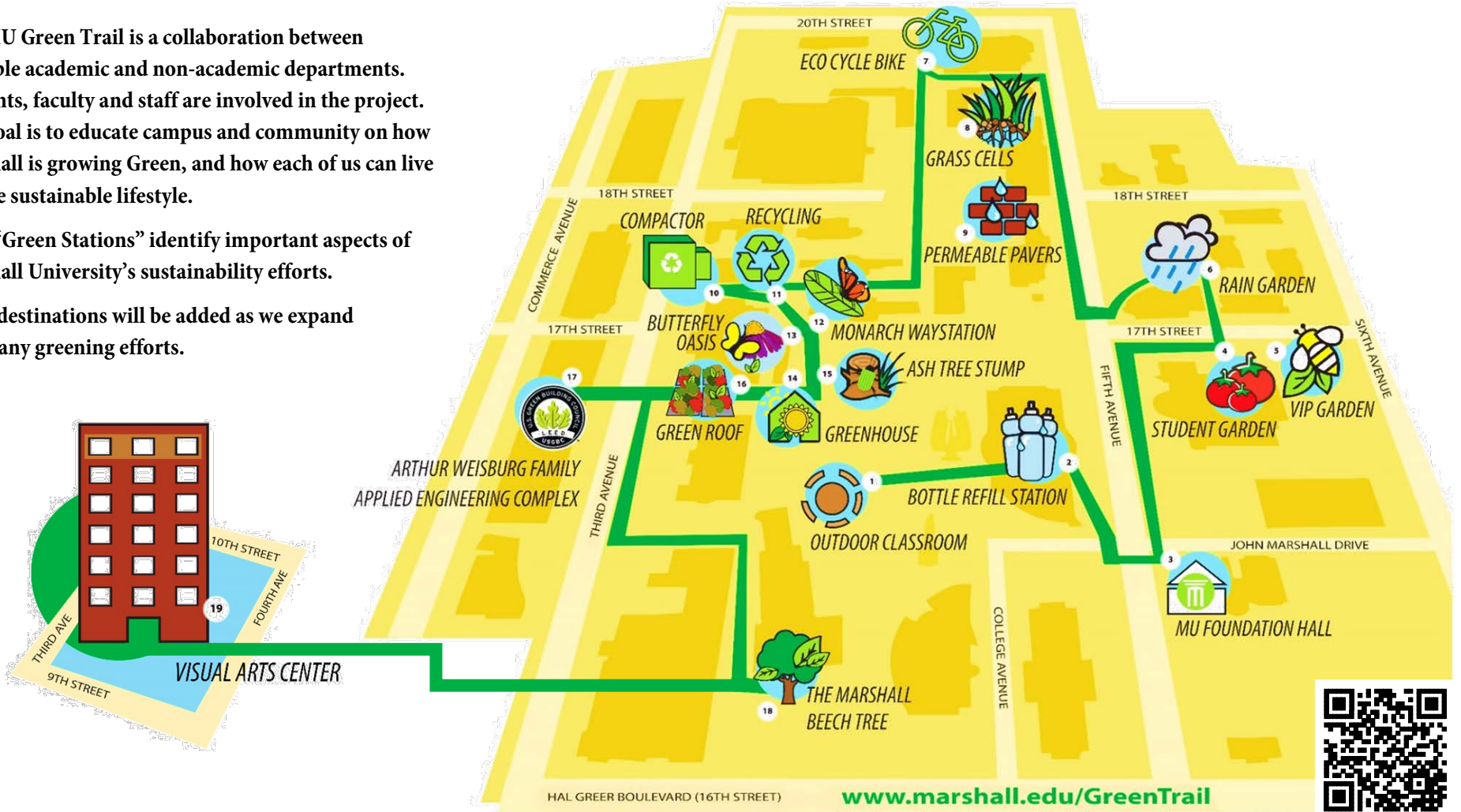
GREEN TRAIL
