The *Heart of Appalachia Educational Opportunity Center* is a federally funded program that helps adults further their education. EOC counselors provide information to participants about vocational or technical training, the college or university of their choice, or Adult Basic Education classes where they can obtain a G.E.D. if needed. EOC counselors also help participants find a suitable financial aid program.

Located on the Marshall University Huntington campus and on the Pt. Pleasant, MOVC campus in Mason County, the Heart of Appalachia EOC serves adults in Lincoln, Mason, and Wayne Counties in West Virginia enroll in the educational institution of their choice.
