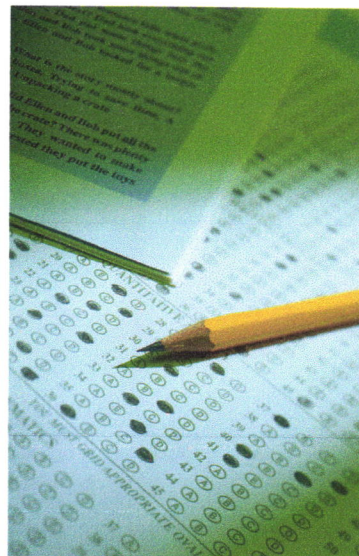

April

-April 2, 1513 - Spanish explorer Ponce De Leon sighted Florida and claimed it for the Spanish Crown after landing at the site of present day St. Augustine, now the oldest city in the continental U.S.

-April 3, 1995 - Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor became the first woman to preside over the Court, sitting in for Chief Justice William H. Rehnquist who was out of town.

-April 4, 1968- Civil Rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was shot and killed by a sniper in Memphis, Tennessee.

-April 6, 1896 - After a break of 1500 years, the first Olympics of the modern era was held in Athens, Greece.

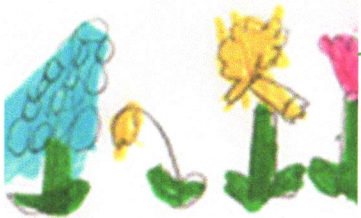
Sudoku Rules:

Directions to Barboursville Park:

Get off Interstate 64 at the 29th Street exit and get on Rt. 60 East heading toward the Huntington Mall. When you pass the Kroger on the left, you will come to a traffic light. Turn right onto Farmdale Road between the Rite-Aid and the 7-11. Continue on Farmdale Road to the second traffic light. Turn right onto Central Avenue. Pass the Post Office, Dollar General and Barboursville Elementary. Turn left onto Barbara Street at the Church. Turn right onto College Avenue. You will pass the Bus Barn on your right. The road winds up the hill. Entrance to Barboursville Community Park is on the right. Turn right at the top of the hill (first picnic areas you will see). We are in Shelter #1.
