- ♦ ALC has 5 men and 7 women NAIA sports and is part of the River States Conference.

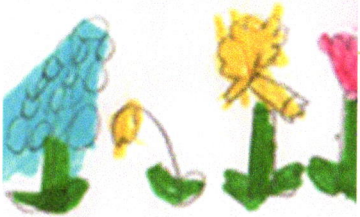

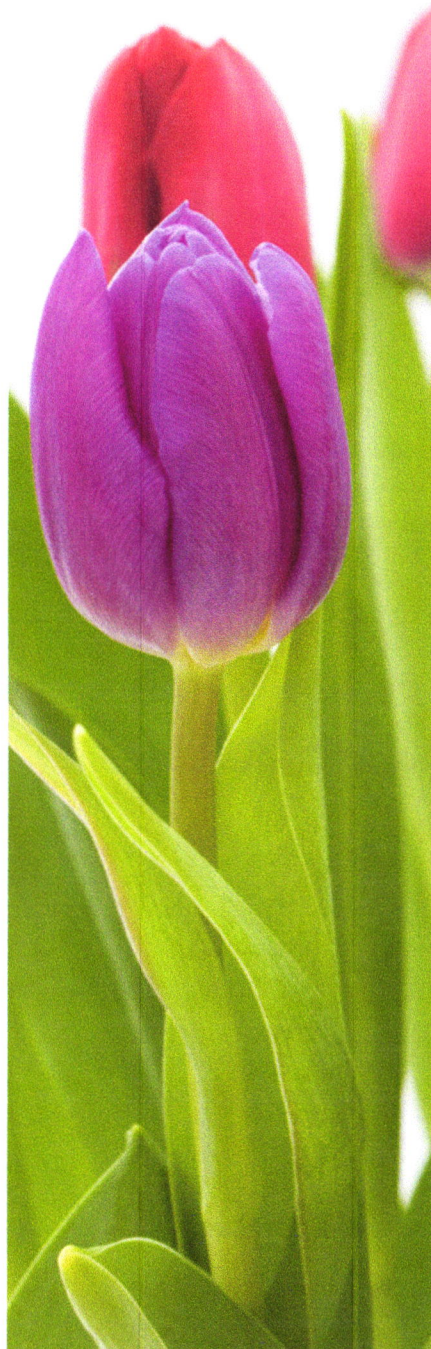

Directions to Barboursville Park:

Get off Interstate 64 at the 29th Street exit and get on Rt. 60 East heading toward the Huntington Mall. When you pass the Kroger on the left, you will come to a traffic light. Turn right onto Farmdale Road between the Rite-Aid and the 7-11. Continue on Farmdale Road to the second traffic light. Turn right onto Central Avenue. Pass the Post Office, Dollar General and Barboursville Elementary. Turn left onto Barbara Street at the Church. Turn right onto College Avenue. You will pass the Bus Barn on your right. The road winds up the hill. Entrance to Barboursville Community Park is on the right. Shelter #8 is by the lake.
