

GENERAL STUDY AND OTHER ACADEMIC TIPS TO MAKE YOUR ACADEMIC CAREER A SUCCESS

- Attend class everyday (even if there's not an attendance policy!).
- Introduce yourself to your professor.
- Read the chapter/text before going to class. It will be much easier to follow the professor and keep up with notes when you have an idea of what he or she is talking about.
- Review your notes after each class session.
- Start projects early; this includes starting to study for exams early! The more you plan ahead, the better your class experience will be.
- Ask questions! More than likely, other people have some of the same questions.
- Use a planner or a calendar to keep track of deadlines, tests, and other important dates.
- Use a particular spot for STUDY ONLY.
- Avoid all-night cram sessions.
