## *Service Awards Presented to More Than 70 Classified, Non-Classified Staff*

More than twelve hundred years of service to Marshall University were celebrated on Wednesday, May 17, as service awards were presented to classified and non-classified employees at milestones of 15, 20, 25, and 30 years, as well as to those retiring from Marshall during the past year.

# Lewis College of Business Reaccredited

The Lewis College of Business (LCOB) has achieved reaffirmation of accreditation of its bachelor and master's degree programs in business for both its Huntington and Charleston locations from the Board of Directors of the International Association for Management Education (AACSB).

"Of over 1,200 collegiate business programs in the nation fewer than 400 have ever met the rigorous accreditation standards of AACSB," Dr. Calvin A. Kent, dean of the LCOB, said. "Marshall is the only school in the region and only one of two in the state of West Virginia to be AACSB accredited, which indicates membership in the elite of collegiate business programs."

According to Kent, in order to achieve accreditation the business programs at Marshall had to satisfy the expectations of a wide range of quality standards relating to curriculum, faculty resources, admission, degree requirements, library and computer facilities, financial resources and intellectual climate.

The LCOB was first accredited in April 1997 prior to its merger with the former West Virginia Graduate College. The merger resulted in the creation of the Graduate School of Management in South Charleston as part of the Lewis College of Business and the reaffirmation of accreditation applies to programs on both Marshall campuses.

"This mark of excellence is a hard earned recognition," Kent said. "It assures our students that they are receiving an education in business that is of the highest possible quality and well equips them for the high-tech global economy of

this new millennium."

The LCOB is nationally noted for its distance education programs. Using interactive television, it offers undergraduate programs at Williamson, Logan and Point Pleasant along with graduate courses in Beckley..

"It is our intention to make sure that students throughout our region have the opportunity to receive the best possible business education," Kent noted.

AACSB is considered by many to be the premier accrediting agency for business schools. Headquartered in St. Louis, AACSB accredits programs in foreign nations as well as the U.S.

## Faculty and Staff Achievements

Three faculty members from the Graduate School of Education and Professional Development have been invited to give presentations at the Second Annual WebCT conference in Athens, Georgia, from July 9-12. Appearing on the program will be **Dr. Sandra Bailey**, associate professor of elementary and secondary education, **Dr. Michael Cunningham**, program director for Leadership Studies, and **Dr. Rudy Pauley**, assistant professor of elementary education. Pauley was also the keynote speaker for the Maine Technical College System Distance Education Symposium 2000, held May 24-26 in Bangor, Maine.

**Robert Bickel** of the College Education and Human Services and **Craig Howley** of Ohio University and AEL, Inc. are co-authors of a paper titled, "The Influence of Scale on School Performance: A Multi-Level Extension of the Matthew Principle." The paper has been accepted for publication by the journal *Educational Policy Analysis Archives*.

**Charles F. Gruber**, associate professor of history, spoke at the May 12 meeting of the Huntington Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. His presentation was titled, "The Latin American Revolutions: People and Issues."
