Peggy Egnatoff Named Employee of the Year

Peggy Egnatoff, Administrative Associate in the College of Fine Arts, has been selected the Marshall University Employee of the Year, according to Jim Stephens, Chairman of the Employee of the Month Selection Committee.

Egnatoff, who has been employed at the university for nearly 20 years, was the September Employee of the Month. She was nominated by Donald Van Horn, Dean of the College of Fine Arts.

In his nomination, Van Horn wrote, "She has exemplified all the characteristics of an extraordinary employee. Peggy is loyal to the institution; she is extremely hard working and efficient. She serves the College of Fine Arts and its departments and programs with a pleasant and helpful attitude, strong attention to detail, and an uncanny knowledge of the many procedures and policies of the university. She frequently makes navigating the institutional bu-

reaucracy much easier for all of us who have the honor of working with her."

The only secretary to serve the College of Fine Arts, Egnatoff drew praise for her creativity, flexibility and her ability to single handedly manage a large variety of tasks.

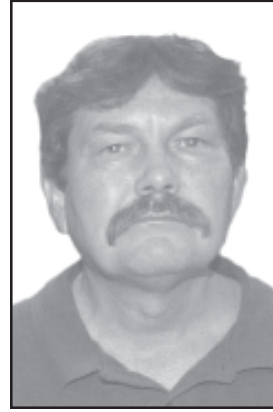

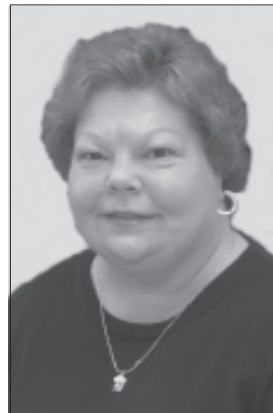
