Marshall University offers a variety of merit-based scholarships to students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement.

Merit-based scholarship programs require that you be enrolled full time and maintain a minimum GPA. Most scholarships are renewable, but some are not. In order for you to continue receiving renewable scholarships, you must continue to meet the scholarship criteria as described in the messages in your Financial Aid Package in your myMU (MILO) account.

Submit FAFSA by March 1 Priority Deadline

Students demonstrating financial need may be eligible for additional scholarships. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov by the priority deadline of March 1 to be considered for all scholarships and need-based financial assistance.

March 1 is deadline for WV Promise Scholarship

To qualify for the Society of Yeager Scholarships Program or qualify for Honors College Scholarships, WV residents must also submit WV Promise Scholarship Application by March 1. To apply for this scholarship, visit www.cfww.com.

Renewal Criteria

Eligibility for institutional scholarship renewal is checked at the end of the spring semester. Should a student fall short of meeting the requirements of scholarship renewal, it is advisable that he/she meet with a financial aid counselor in the Office of Student Financial Assistance to inquire about the consequences and options. Scholarship recipients may take courses during the summer to make up a deficiency with credits or GPA. In this instance, students must contact the Office of Student Financial Assistance when the summer course(s) are completed. However, at the start of the fall semester, if the student fails to meet all scholarship renewal criteria, the award is cancelled and will no longer be available to the student.

Combining Scholarship Awards

In all cases, the total amount a student is awarded cannot exceed the cost of a Marshall University education. In some instances, when Title IV (certain Federal Financial Aid programs) and WV Higher Education Grant Programs are awarded, students are limited to receive grants and scholarships up to the student's demonstrated financial need.

If you are not living on campus, your institutional scholarships may not exceed tuition, fees and an additional \$1,000. Should you choose to live off campus and your institutional scholarships exceed this amount, your institutional scholarship awards may be reduced. This

does not include other scholarships and financial aid you may receive from federal, state, and external sources unless those funds have specific restrictions.

Student athletes who have been offered an academic scholarship should discuss the award with a financial aid counselor in the Office of Student Financial Assistance to determine whether or not the scholarship can be accepted. Under NCAA rules, student athletes are limited in the amount of institutional gift aid they may receive. Institutional aid includes both athletic scholarships and institutional merit scholarships.

Outside Scholarships

Outside scholarships are processed by the Office of the Bursar. You may be asked to come to the Office of the Bursar to endorse a check as some are made out to Marshall University and the student. Outside scholarship funds will be applied to your account just like institutional scholarship awards after the outside scholarship check has been cashed. Outside scholarships are considered a source of financial aid and follow the same rules under the **Combining Scholarship Awards** section of this menu.

Scholarship Funding Source Replacement

Marshall University has the right to replace an awarded scholarship with another named scholarship to maximize funding sources. Such changes will not reduce the amount of the student's scholarship, and in some cases, may actually result in an increase to a student's scholarship amount.

Holding Scholarships for Interrupted Attendance

Marshall University may hold a student's scholarship if his/her attendance is interrupted for medical reason, military deployment, or other extenuating circumstances provided the student continues to meet the eligibility requirements. The student must submit an appeal to the Office of Student Financial Assistance and submit verification of reason for leaving (i.e. doctor note, military deployment notification). A student who transfers to another college or university does not qualify for scholarship reinstatement after a break in attendance at Marshall University.

Thank You Letter Requirement

Recipients of Marshall University Endowed and Annual Scholarships are required to submit a thank you letter to their scholarship donor(s).

Below are guidelines for writing thank you letters:

Your letter should—

- Use a formal salutation including the appropriate prefixes and suffixes.

Example: Dear Dr. and Mrs. McCoy

- Include a personal thank you referring to the specific scholarship you received.

- Include information about your interests and activities, what the scholarship means to you, and your educational and career goals.
- Sign your letter.

Once you have written your letter—

- prepare an envelope with your scholarship name, but do not seal the envelope.

West Virginia & U.S. Department of Education Scholarships and Grants

WV PROMISE Scholarship

Up to \$4,750 is available to qualified students to offset tuition and fee charges for the academic year. It is funded by West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission and is awarded to WV high-school seniors on the basis of their high school records and test scores. Please review the PROMISE Scholarship website for application procedures, deadlines and scholarship criteria. To apply for this scholarship visit www.cfwb.com and click on the **Scholarship** tab.

WV Engineering, Science and Technology Scholarship

Up to \$3,000 is available for high school graduating students, who may apply for this scholarship if accepted for enrollment as a full-time student in an engineering, science or technology program. Funding from this scholarship is from the state of WV. For more information about this program and to apply for this scholarship, visit www.cfwb.com and click on the **Scholarship** tab.

Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program

(\$1500) - Funding from this scholarship program is from the federal government, but is administered by the WV Higher Education Policy Commission in cooperation with the WV Department of Education. Students make initial application for this scholarship with their high school guidance counselor. The deadline to apply for this scholarship is March 1 prior to the academic year you plan to attend. Underwood-Smith Teacher Scholarship Program

(Up to \$5,000) - This is a WV state funded program that is available to students who are accepted or enrolled as a full-time student in a course of study leading to certification as a teacher at the pre-school, elementary, middle, or secondary level.

This program is available to both undergraduate and graduate students. Undergraduate students must have a 3.25 grade point average after completing two years of coursework. Graduate students must be graduating in the top 10 percent of his/her college/university graduating class or have a 3.5 grade point average or above. Students must agree to teach in WV for a period of time upon graduation. If a recipient of the Underwood-Smith Teacher Scholarship Program does not fulfill the service requirements, he/she will have to pay back the scholarship including interest. Federal TEACH Grant

(Up to \$4,000 per year) - This is available to students who intend to teach in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families for four years within eight years of completing their degree leading to a career in teaching. To receive a TEACH Grant, you must meet the following criteria:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal
- Student Aid (FAFSA), although you do not need to demonstrate financial need
- Be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student
- Be enrolled in coursework that is necessary to begin a career in teaching
- Meet certain academic achievement requirements (generally, scoring above the 75th percentile on a college admissions test or maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25)
- Complete TEACH Grant Entrance Counseling
- Sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS)
- Complete a Marshall University TEACH Grant Application and be approved

If you do not meet the terms of the TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS), your Federal Teach Grant will convert into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement.

Society of Yeager Scholars

Society of Yeager Scholars receive scholarships totaling the cost of tuition, standard fees, room and board (student must maintain residence on campus), a stipend, a book allowance, a personal computer, a summer study program at Exeter College, Oxford, and funds for further study abroad experience (after applying any qualifying federal and state grants and scholarships). John Marshall Honors Scholarship

(Up to \$4,200) - Awarded to first-time freshmen with a minimum ACT Composite Score of 30 (SAT Score of at least 1330 CR + M) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average who accept admission into the Honors College by May 15.

Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov and apply for WV Promise Scholarship at www.cfww.com by March 1 during their senior year of high school to receive this scholarship.

Students who are selected to receive the WV Promise Scholarship will receive a \$1,750 John Marshall Honors Scholarship that may be applied to tuition, fees and any other educational expenses.

Students who are not selected to receive the WV Promise Scholarship will receive a \$4,200 John Marshall Honors tuition waiver scholarship, which may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Maintain good standing with the Honors College
- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.2 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.5 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

John Marshall Honors Scholarship recipients also qualify to receive the Presidential Scholarship.

Mary Willis Marshall Honors Scholarship

(Up to \$1,500) - Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score between 26 and 29 (SAT Score between 1170 and 1320 CR+M) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average who accept admission into the Honors College by May 15.

Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov and apply for WV Promise Scholarship at www.cfww.com by March 1 during their senior year of high school to receive this scholarship.

Students who are selected to receive the WV Promise Scholarship will receive a \$500 John Marshall Honors Scholarship that may be applied to tuition, fees and any other educational expenses.

Students who are not selected to receive the WV Promise Scholarship will receive a \$1500 John Marshall Honors tuition waiver scholarship, which may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

Mary Willis Marshall Honors Scholarship recipients also qualify to receive the Presidential Scholarship.

Presidential Scholarship

(Up to \$1,250) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score of 24 or higher (SAT Score 1090 CR+M or higher) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.3 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

A. Michael Perry Scholarship

(Up to \$750) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score between 21 and 23 (SAT Score between 980 and 1080 CR+M) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.2 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

A. Michael Perry Scholarship

(Up to \$500) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score of 21 or higher (SAT Score of 980 CR+M or higher) and a 3.2 to 3.49 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 2.75 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

Dependents of Marshall University employees may apply for this scholarship by completing the Employee Dependent Undergraduate Scholarship Program application. Transfer Student Scholarship for In-state Students

(Up to \$1,000) - Transfer students who have earned a minimum of 26 credits and have a transfer credit cumulative grade point average of 3.5 qualify for this scholarship.

This scholarship is renewable for two additional semesters beyond the first year of eligibility as long as the student maintains an overall grade point average of 3.5 and successfully completes 26 credits at Marshall University after one academic year. This is a tuition waiver scholarship and may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

Board of Governors Honors Scholarship

(Up to \$2,500) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with a minimum ACT Composite Score of 26 or higher (SAT Score of 1170 CR + M or higher) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average who accept admission into the Honors College by May 15.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Maintain good standing with the Honors College
- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.2 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.5 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

Board of Governors Honors Scholarship recipients also qualify to receive the River Cities Scholarship.

River Cities Scholarship

(Up to \$1,500) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score of 24 or higher (SAT Score 1090 CR+M or higher) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.3 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

A. Michael Perry Scholarship for Metro Students

(Up to \$750) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score between 21 and 23 (SAT Score between 980 and 1080 CR+M) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.2 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

This is a tuition waiver scholarship and may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

Society of Yeager Scholars

John Laidley Honors Scholarship

(Up to \$2,000) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with a minimum ACT Composite Score of 26 or higher (SAT Score of 1170 CR + M or higher) and a 3.5 H.S. Grade Point Average who accept admission into the Honors College by May 15.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Maintain good standing with the Honors College
- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 3.2 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 3.5 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

John Laidley Honors Scholarship recipients also qualify to receive the Horizon Scholarship.

Horizon Scholarship

(Up to \$3,500) – Awarded to first-time freshmen with ACT Composite Score of 23 or higher (SAT Score 1050 CR+M or higher) and a 2.75 H.S. Grade Point Average.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Successfully complete at least 26 credits each academic year
- Earn at least a 2.5 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of freshman year
- Earn at least a 2.75 cumulative Grade Point Average by the end of sophomore and junior years

This is a tuition waiver scholarship, which may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

Students who qualify for the Horizon Scholarship may also qualify for the Achievement Scholarship.

Achievement Scholarship

(Up to \$2,000) – Awarded to students who receive the Horizon Scholarship and demonstrate financial need. Students considered for this scholarship must be accepted for Admission and file the FAFSA by March 1 of their senior year of high school.

This is a 4-year scholarship that is renewable. The renewal criteria are as follows:

- Continue to maintain eligibility for the Horizon Scholarship
- File the FAFSA annually by March 1
- Continue to demonstrate financial need

Alumni Legacy Scholarship

The Alumni Legacy Scholarship Program has been developed to encourage children and grandchildren from outside the Huntington metropolitan area to consider attending Marshall University by providing a scholarship that would help offset the difference between in-state and non-resident tuition costs. To qualify for the award amounts below, the student must be entering as a first-time full-time freshman and be charged non-resident tuition rates. The parent or grandparent must be an active (dues paying) member of the Marshall University Alumni Association.

Tier I: Award amount is up to \$7,500

Requirements: A minimum of 25 ACT composite score (or SAT 1130) and a 3.5 high school grade-point average.

Tier 2: Award amount is up to \$6,000

Requirements: A minimum of 23 ACT composite score (or SAT 1080) and a 3.0 high school grade-point average.

Students who have a composite ACT Score between 21 and 22 (SAT Score between 980 and 1070), a minimum high school grade point average of 3.0 and has demonstrated leadership through high school activities or community service may also be considered.

The Alumni Legacy Scholarship award amount may not exceed the maximums stated above. The Alumni Legacy Scholarship is reduced when a student also qualifies for other Marshall University scholarships such as John Laidley Honors Scholarship and Horizon Scholarship. For example, if a student qualifies for both Alumni Legacy-Tier I and Horizon, the student would be awarded the Horizon Scholarship in the amount of \$3,000 and Alumni Legacy Scholarship in the amount of \$4,500. This is a tuition waiver scholarship and may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.

Transfer Student Scholarship for Out-of-State Students

(Up to \$2,900) – Transfer students who have earned a minimum of 26 credits and have a transfer credit cumulative grade point average of 3.5 qualify for this scholarship. This scholarship is renewable for two additional semesters beyond the first year of eligibility as long as the student maintains an overall grade point average of 3.5 and successfully completes 26 credits at Marshall University after one academic year. This is a tuition waiver scholarship and may only be applied to Marshall University tuition charges; it may not be applied to charges for on-line courses.
