SOPHOMORE IN HIGH SCHOOL AND BELOW (UZ91)
<ul> <li>Be currently enrolled in high school or a home-school program.</li> <li>Completed admission application.</li> <li>An ACT / SAT score at the 85th percentile or above [ACT Composite = 24, SAT Total Score = 1160]. If the ACT or SAT has not been taken, a score at the 90th percentile or higher on another nationally normed standardized test that provides evidence of the ability to succeed at the college level is required.</li> <li>A current high school transcript reflecting a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale.</li> <li>A letter of recommendation from applicant's counselor or principal.</li> <li>To take English or math courses, a student must have a qualifying ACT or SAT score in the subject area.</li> </ul>
JUNIOR OR SENIOR YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL (UZ92)
<ul> <li>Be currently enrolled in high school or a home-school program.</li> <li>Completed admission application.</li> <li>A current high school transcript reflecting a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale.</li> <li>A letter of recommendation from applicant's counselor or principal.</li> <li>To take English or math courses, a student must have a qualifying ACT or SAT score in the subject area.</li> </ul>
INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR OR SENIOR YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL (UZ92)
<ul> <li>Be currently enrolled in high school program.</li> <li>Completed admission application.</li> <li>A current high school transcript reflecting a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale.</li> <li>US high school – high school transcript reflecting a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.00 on 4.00 scale</li> <li>Non-US high school – high school transcript in original language along with a certified English translation from the institution reflecting a minimum 3.00 GPA on 4.00 scale; in some cases, high school transcripts may need to be evaluated by an accepted evaluation agency (please contact the Office of Admissions for more information).</li> <li>A letter of recommendation from applicant's counselor or principal.</li> <li>Proof of English proficiency. If the student is currently attending a school in which the primary language of instruction for all programs is English, the counselor or principal from that high school can certify in writing that English is the official language of instruction.
