APPLY ONLINE!

After we receive all of your application materials, your credentials will be evaluated and, if admissible, you will be sent a letter of admission and the appropriate immigration form. The form is used to apply for a student visa at any American embassy or consulate. After you have been admitted to the University, you will also receive information about applying for on-campus housing and completing our arrival survey in case you need transportation from Huntington Tri-State Airport (HTS) or Charleston Yeager Airport (CRW).

DISTANCE LEARNING

Marshall University offers graduate programs which are conducted entirely online. Distance-Only students are not expected to have a campus or classroom presence during their academic careers and are eligible for a distance tuition rate in lieu of regular tuition and fees. International Distance Learning students will not be issued an I-20, and, therefore, proof of financial support is not required. To apply to a distance program, students must apply online by submitting the Graduate Application for Distance-ONLY Learning at www.marshall.edu/admissions/apply.

STEPS TO APPLY

Marshall University is authorized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services to enroll non-immigrant visa students with F-1 or J-1 status.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS MUST SUBMIT ALL OF THE FOLLOWING TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION

1. APPLICATION FORM

Complete the International Graduate Application for Admission form.

2. INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE APPLICATION FEES

A \$150 USD non-refundable application fee. Check or money order made payable to Marshall University. To be accepted, all checks must have a 9-digit routing number. You can also pay the \$150 fee with a Visa, Mastercard, American Express or Discover card. Contact the Marshall University Admissions Office for details.

3. OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts must be in English and the original language and contain ALL college or university academic credits and grades. The transcripts must be sent directly to Marshall University Graduate Admissions office by the designated official at the institution that you attended. You may, in some cases, be required to have an evaluation completed by an approved evaluation agency.

4. EVIDENCE OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Proof of your proficiency in English may be certified by submitting one of the following:

- (TOEFL) Test of English as a Foreign Language (Internet based) minimum score of 80 for graduate study. ETS code for Marshall University is #5396.
- (MELAB) Michigan English language Assessment Battery minimum score of 82 for graduate study.
- (IELTS) the International English Language Testing System minimum score of 6.5 for graduate study.
- Completion of Level 6 of Marshall's Academic English program, with minimum B's in all courses.
- Completion of Marshall Pathway course ENG 160 or ENG 101A with minimum C grade.
- Diploma or degree from an English speaking school – a degree or diploma from an accredited secondary school, college or university in which the primary language of instruction is English.
- Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university in the United States.

*Test results taken more than two (2) years prior to the date of the application cannot be accepted. Some programs may require higher scores for admission.

5. AFFIDAVIT OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Marshall University currently requires that the international student demonstrate proof of financial support to cover the tuition and living expenses for one (1) academic year (9 months). We estimate this amount to be \$34,284 USD. (In some cases, a 50% deposit will be required in order to issue the I-20 form.) Proof of financial support may be demonstrated in several ways:

- An affidavit of financial support from a personal sponsor (parent, relative, friend, etc.) that has been certified by a U.S. bank or financial institution.
- A scholarship agency (government, corporation, etc.) stating the availability of funds and the intention to support your educational and living expenses for the entire duration of study at Marshall University.
- Personal funds, provided you submit documented evidence of a bank statement from a U.S. bank or financial institution or its affiliate in U.S. dollars (USD). A statement from your employer certifying that you have been granted study leave and salary support arrangements may also be acceptable.

6. GRADUATE RECORD EXAMINATION (GRE) OR GRADUATE MANAGEMENT ADMISSION TEST (GMAT)

Some departments will not consider applications without GRE, GMAT or other graduate admission test scores. Students should refer to the graduate catalog on our website, www.marshall.edu/graduate, for additional requirements and application deadlines for specific programs.
