ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOR A PROGRAM OF STUDY

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE FROM MOUNTWEST COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE LEADING TO A

BACHELOR OF ART IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

FROM MARSHALL UNIVERSITY

Marshall University (Marshall) and Mountwest Community and Technical College (Mountwest), in order to facilitate the efficient transfer of students between the two institutions, hereby establish this articulated program of study leading to the Bachelor of Art degree in Criminal Justice to be granted by Marshall. Students who meet admission requirements may be admitted to Marshall to complete the requirements for the Bachelor of Art degree in Criminal Justice. Marshall University will accept up to 72 hours of college-level course credit from MountWest for this degree.

The courses listed in this articulation agreement have been approved by both institutions as fulfilling the necessary and sufficient course requirements for the respective degrees.

Students working toward a degree will be encouraged to work with academic advisors to ensure their previous, current, and future courses fulfill the requirements listed herein. Course substitutions may be available upon the approval of the appropriate Marshall or Mountwest department chair and academic dean.

The plans of study are presented as illustrative for full-time students who have fulfilled course prerequisites and completed courses as outlined. Students should note that courses provided by Marshall will be offered in the sequence presented.

Students who do not complete the sequence of courses outlined in this agreement may require additional time and expense to complete the degree.

Marshall and Mountwest agree to monitor and support the provisions of this agreement to ensure program consistency and quality, and transferability of the benefit of the students of both institutions. Marshall and Mountwest agree to coordinate changes in the course content or requirements for any courses listed in the articulation agreement in order to ensure continued comparability between the courses offered on each campus.

Marshall and Mountwest agree to renegotiate this agreement as necessary due to changes in curriculum or graduation requirements implemented by either institution. This process will be the responsibility of the appropriate deans at both institutions. This agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party: provided that the students currently pursuing a degree shall be permitted to complete the degree.

Students pursuing a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice through the articulation agreement will be bound by the curriculum requirements in effect at the time they are officially

accepted into the articulated program. The attached curriculum requirements dated May 24, 2018 will be in effect until officially changed and agreed upon by both institutions.

The terms of this agreement are hereby approved on May 24, 2018 by the respective administration of the two schools.
