3. First-time Freshmen Financial Aid- Kathy Bialk

- 2,057 have been sent so far.
- The week of January 26 was the first batch of letters.
- There are still about 600 students who haven't completed their FAFSA letters.

- Get a cheat sheet for SAP codes.
- Would others like to be able to search for students who aren't their own advisees? Brian Morgan can give that access.
- Get access to SGASTDN.
- Elizabeth Hanrahan is currently working with Financial Aid and Human Resources to remove SSNs from PARs.
- The masking was turned on to test it. Unless your specific use requires a SSN, you will not be able to see it.

5. Career Exploration Experience- Denise Hogsett

- There is a timeline.
- 8 out of 10 employers signed up, and 12 are waiting.
- Roll out of the application process will begin February 20.
- The application deadline is March 3.
- The students will meet in a workshop prior to starting their shadowing.
- After their job shadowing is complete, they will be required to bring a reflection piece.
- There are a wide range of employer types.
