# 2011 Graduation Survey Data Marshall University

Office of Assessment and Program Review

- Unless otherwise noted, all findings are essentially unchanged since 2010.
- Overall response rate was 41% (672 respondents out of 1,628 graduates) up from 35% in 2010.
- Females were more likely than males to respond to the survey.
- Students who completed Bachelor's Degrees were more likely to respond than were students who completed Associate's Degrees.
- The Mean GPA of respondents (3.19) was significantly higher than that of all graduates (3.08).
- Response rates differed significantly across colleges.
- Respondents did not differ from the cohort in terms of race and age.

- Most respondents were single with no children, were WV residents, and completed their entire education at Marshall.
- Thirty-three percent reported no educational debt, while 36% reported debt greater than \$20,000. debt > \$20,000 is higher than in 2010.
- Most respondents stated that their educational objective was to begin their first career.
- Fifty-six percent of respondents said they had participated in an internship or practicum, with 63% believing this experience had helped them find employment. - efficacy of internships reported on a higher level than in 2010.
- Sixty-two percent of respondents indicated that they intend to pursue graduate studies, while only 4% indicated that they intend to work for a Volunteer Organization such as the Peace Corps or AmeriCorps.
- Most students reported that they intend to remain in WV to complete graduate studies and most chose Marshall University for this purpose.

- Students reported positive feelings about all aspects of their MU education. On a scale of 1 – 5, with 1 being "strongly agree," 2 being "agree," 3 being "neither agree nor disagree," 4 being "disagree" and 5 being "strongly disagree," means exceeded 2 for only six out of fourteen items. These included
  - Believing that writing intensive courses were effective (2.37)
  - Developing the ability to use mathematics effectively (2.26)
  - Believing science courses increased understanding of the scientific process (2.27)
  - Increasing appreciation of the arts (2.23)
  - Receiving adequate training in computers and technology appropriate to major field (2.11)
  - Finding the capstone experience valuable (2.06) mean was 1.99 in 2010

- On a scale of 1 5, with 1 being "very satisfied," 2 being "satisfied," 3 being "neutral," 4 being "dissatisfied," and 5 being "very dissatisfied," students reported greater satisfaction with
  - the quality of teaching (1.80) than with
  - the quality of advising (2.29)
  - classroom and lab facilities (2.35)
  - academic support services (2.24)
- Sixty-one percent of respondents plan to be employed in their major field, 13% not in their major field, and 26% were unsure at the time of the survey.
- Sixty-three percent plan to work in WV.
- Forty-four percent (of the 464 students who answered the question) reported having accepted a job (Up from 22% in 2010). Of those, 68% will earn \$30,000 + annually (Up from 55% in 2010).
- Only 24% of respondents reported using Career Services, with JobTrax and Resume Assistance used most frequently.
