## Ravenswood Grade School School-wide Expectations

- Lead: Teacher and students practice positive behaviors (We do)
- Test: Students demonstrate positive behaviors (You do)

#### Check list

- ✓ Student Voice: Students will help choose this as an important classroom Teach-To
- ✓ Student Input: Students will provide (but not practice) examples of all behaviors
- ✓ Teacher Role: Teacher will model positive behaviors
- ✓ Student Role: Students will model positive behaviors only
- ✓ Assessment: Teachers will reteach or revisit as necessary

What improvements or changes will you make next time?

- · Speak clearly when giving your lunch number
- · Sit quietly until given permission to talk
- · Keep food to yourself or on your tray- no food sharing
- Remain seated until dismissed to empty
- · Keep area clean

#### Playground

- OFF LIMITS AT ALL TIME: fence, ditch, trees, and soccer field
- No Pushing, hitting, shoving, or kicking
   On the swings:
- · Always face forward looking straight
- Stop before getting off swings
- · Take turns

#### On the Monkey bars:

- Cross one person at a time
- · Never climb on top of the monkey bars
- Take turns
   On the Big Toy:
- Go down slides one at a time, on your bottom
- · Never run up slides
- · Take turns

### Ravenswood Grade School Restroom Teach-To

Goal: Students will be able to safely and efficiently use the restroom so as not to interfere with instructional time.

Rationale: Restroom behavior is an important life skill that students need in order to be responsibly use public facilities and manage one's self in a sanitary manner.







Coberly will help soccer and basketball groups transition.


Craigo will be our timekeeper and help us transition using a whistle. She will also help hula hoops and freeze tag transition.

Mills will help scooter racing and bowling transition.






Behavior data will be tracked throughout the year to give staff the opportunity to make needed adjustments. Behavior data will be tracked by class, grade, and school.
