Purpose: The Behavior/Mental Health Technical Assistance Center was created to address requests from across the Mountain State for local supports related to student behavior/mental health needs and to improve and maintain the continuity of existing interventions in schools. The center offers training and technical assistance in a variety of areas. Interventions supported by the center are based on national models and research related to multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) and interconnected systems framework (ISF).

Note: The Behavior/Mental Health Technical Assistance Center is funded by the West Virginia Department of Education's Office of Special Education and Student Support and is housed at the West Virginia Autism Training Center at Marshall University.
