# Why attend the Career Fair?

### **Get Comfortable**

The first time you walk up to a potential employer, you will feel a bit nervous. For some, it may be the hardest thing they have ever done. It will give you a chance to practice your elevator speech and follow-up skills. This is not something you can easily do with an online job search.

## To Present Yourself as a Person, Not a Piece of Paper

Career Fairs offer job seekers a chance to make a lasting impression on employers by interacting with them personally—it is impossible to make this type of connection when submitting a resume. In addition, meeting a job recruiter for a company in person could potentially make up for what your resume may lack. This could ultimately allow you to get your foot in the door with a company that interests you.



## Land a Job or Internship

This is the main reason why people should attend a career fair. If you make a good impression, you may end up with an interview right on the spot. Even if they don't interview you immediately, they will take your resume and get back to you at a later time. The more contacts you make, the more opportunities you will have to land a job or internship. Online job searches can lead to jobs and internships, but why limit your opportunities?

#### 1. Research Employers Attending the Career Fair

- Log in to Handshake and find the Career Fair event page to see the full list of companies attending.
- Click on employer profiles to learn about their organization, open positions, and what they're looking for in candidates.
- Make a list of top companies you want to visit and prepare specific questions to ask recruiters.

#### 2. Register for the Career Fair Prep Session

• Attend our Career Fair Prep Session on Tuesday, the 18th, at 12 PM to get expert tips on networking, resumes, and making a great impression.

#### 3. Update Your Handshake Profile

- Ensure your profile is complete and up to date, including your resume, major, graduation date, and career interests.
- Employers often check Handshake before and after the career fair, so having a strong profile makes a great impression.

#### 4. Apply for Jobs & Internships in Advance

- Many employers post job and internship openings on Handshake before attending the fair.
- Applying in advance shows initiative and gives you a conversation starter.

#### 5. Schedule a Resume Review or Career Coaching Session

 Book an appointment with the Office of Career Education through Handshake to have your resume reviewed or practice your elevator pitch before the fair.

- How can I make the most out of an internship at your company?


