Treasures of the Ramsdell House

This course will introduce students to the dynamic history of the Underground Railroad, the Abolition Movement, and the Civil War in Ceredo, West Virginia and to the rich historical resources held at the Ramsdell house.

The course is made up of five online lessons. Each lesson has a video lecture and an opportunity for engagement. Nothing in the course is graded or has a time limit.

Lecture for lesson 1: Broad Outline

Video Tour

This lesson will literally follow the Ramsdell House director as she gives a tour of the house, grounds, and collections at the historic site itself.

Video Exploration 1 and 2

In the video explorations, the course instructor will walk students through reading, interpreting, and learning from a series of documents and material history from the Ramsdell House Collection. The first session will focus on the pre-Civil War period. The second session will focus on the Civil War itself. Documents will include letters, and material history will include clothing and household artefacts.
