Join us this Summer for the West Virginia Governor's School of Entrepreneurship!

The <u>West Virginia Governor's School of Entrepreneurship (GSE)</u> is a **10-day program** designed specifically for **West Virginia students currently in 9th–11th grade** (public, private, or homeschooled). Students will stay on campus at Marshall University from July 11-20 for this fully immersive experience. It equips young minds with the tools to become tomorrow's entrepreneurs and changemakers through:

- Hands-on innovation challenges
- Real-world problem solving
- Mentorship from successful entrepreneurs and industry professionals

Students will leave with new skills, fresh ideas, and the confidence to take on leadership roles in their schools and communities.

- Eligibility: Current 9th-11th grade WV students (public, private, or home school)
- Minimum GPA: 2.5
- Extended Deadline to apply: April 30, 2025 Applications
- Requirements: School transcripts + 3 recommendations (principal + 2 teachers)



Dr. Uday Tate selected for Faculty Distinguished Service Award

Dr. Uday Tate was selected by the Provost and the President for a Faculty Distinguished Service Award at the MU General Faculty Meeting on Thursday, April 10th at the Joan C. Edwards Playhouse. The award is given to faculty who have served Marshall University for at least 20 years, have a record of distinguished service to the institution and/or college, and a record of distinguished teaching as evidenced by peer, administrative and/or student evaluations.



Marshall University's 86th Annual Alumni Awards Ceremony

Sam Hood was selected for the Lewis College of Business Alumni Award of Distinction at Marshall University's 86th Annual Alumni Awards Ceremony for his many achievements in businesses and cofounding one of Marshall's proudest ventures - its national championship soccer program. Hood graduated from the College of Business in 1976 with a degree in marketing. As a business leader, Hood owned and grew Huntington Piping, Inc. for 20 years before founding a real estate development firm with his sons. Donating the success he achieved through his business ventures, Sam established the Marshall and Dorothy Hood Scholarship to support future Marshall students.

Hood co-founded Marshall's national championship soccer program in 1979, later becoming its head coach in 1981. In 1996, he built and donated the university's first soccer field, which bore his name for nearly two decades. After a successful career in business, Hood became an award-winning author, publishing three nonfiction Civil War history books. His books won the 2013 Albert C. Castel Civil War History Book of the Year Award and the 2015 Walt Whitman Civil War History Book of the Year Award. Because of his achievements in business, the literary industry, and in the local community, Hood was inducted into the Greater Huntington Hall of Fame in 2021.
