He has published in the Journal of Business, The Academy of Management Journal, the Journal of Banking and Finance, the Journal of Futures Markets, the Journal of Derivatives, the Review of Futures Markets, and others.

He holds an A.C.I.B. from The Chartered Institute of Bankers (London), now the Institute of Banking & Finance, London, an MBA (with Distinction) from Wake Forest and a PhD in (Business Administration: Finance) from the University of South Carolina.

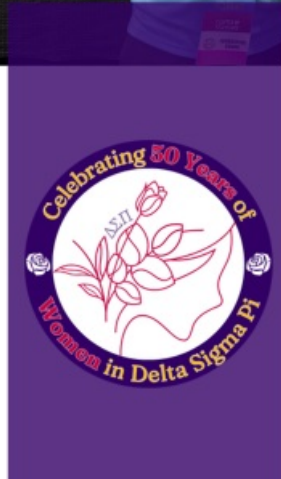
