## Marshall University Students and Advisor Recognized at 2026 SAM International Business Conference

PROVIDENCE, RI – March 23, 2026 – Marshall University achieved outstanding success at the 2026 Society for Advancement of Management (SAM) International Business Conference, with students and faculty earning national and regional recognition over three days of competitions, presentations, and professional development.

Marshall students competed in the Knowledge Bowl, Extemporaneous Speech Competition, and Written Case Study Competition, demonstrating leadership, analytical skills, and business acumen. The Open Division team—Michael Borsuk, Chris Hermann, Eli Howard, Brandon Kelley, and Clare Walker—won 1st Place in the Written Case Study Competition, which focused on Senesco, Inc., a Rhode Island-based manufacturer specializing in defense and marine vessels. The team toured Senesco as part of the experience, gaining firsthand insights into the company's operations, innovation, and collaborative culture. Brandon Kelley's leadership in authoring the team's case report was instrumental to the team's success.

Clare Walker received the National SAM Outstanding Student Award, recognizing exemplary leadership as President of Marshall's Delta Sigma Pi chapter. Additionally, Michael Borsuk and Brandon Kelley received Regional Outstanding Student

Awards in recognition of their leadership and contributions to the SAM organization. This marked the first SAM International Business Conference for all participating students except Jamison Lewis.

Marshall University advisor Glen Midkiff was honored with his fourth SAM Outstanding Advisor Award, along with the Gold Medal for Outstanding Advisor, in recognition of sustained guidance and support in developing student leaders and strengthening the chapter. Midkiff also served as a session chair during the conference.

Furthermore, Jamison Lewis and Brandon Kelley presented the “Shark Tank Innovation Challenge: Empowering Student Entrepreneurs to Create Healthy Organizations” session to students and faculty from multiple institutions. Jamison Lewis additionally participated in a leadership panel, sharing expertise in team management and innovation.

Dr. Marc Sollosy, member of the SAM Board of Directors, was recognized for his outstanding service and leadership on the board.

The 2026 SAM International Business Conference provided Marshall University students with an unparalleled opportunity to compete, collaborate, and engage with business leaders and peers from across the nation, highlighting the university’s commitment to fostering leadership, innovation, and professional development.
