The West Virginia Regional Partnership for Children and Families (WVRPCF) impacted by Substance Use Disorder

### Family Snapshot

<b>Focal Parent</b>	
<b>Number Enrolled</b>	76 Families
<b>Age and Gender</b>	94% are female and 58% fall in the age range of 18-30 years old.
<b>Education</b>	67% of the parents have at least a high school diploma.
<b>Employment</b>	84% are unemployed
<b>Income</b>	67% receive public assistance that includes TANF, WIC and Food Stamps/SNAP.
<b>Marital Status</b>	57% of the parents have never been married.
<b>Primary Substance Use</b>	40% of the adults reported their primary substance as being Methamphetamines/Amphetamines and 25% reported it as being Heroin/Other Opiates, 17% Marijuana, 2% Alcohol, 4% MAT medication, and 10% other substances.
<b>Trauma</b>	A reduction in trauma symptoms was seen by discharge.
<b>Mental Health</b>	93% of the parents showed a decrease in depression symptoms after 6 months.
<b>Parenting Skills</b>	Not reported at this time
<b>Recovery Services related to Substance Use</b>	Duplication may occur because an individual may be in multiple services or one service multiple times. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 8 or 16%-Outpatient Therapy for Substance Use.</li> <li>• 22 or 45%-Medically Assisted Treatment</li> <li>• 8 or 16%-Detox</li> <li>• 12 or 24%-28 Day Program</li> <li>• 13 or 27%-Residential Treatment Program</li> <li>• 2 or 4%-Residential Treatment Program with Child</li> </ul>
<b>Other Services the Families were Referred</b>	Other Services families are referred to include: Early Intervention, Housing, Legal Services, Medical Care, Birth to Three, WIC and Food and Clothing.
<b>Number of Adults Served in the Family including Focal Parent</b>	164

<b>Focal Child</b>	
<b>Age and Gender</b>	49% of the children are age 6 months or younger and 54% of the children are females.
<b>Prenatal Care and Substance Exposure in Utero.</b>	42% of the children did not receive adequate prenatal care. 64% were exposed to substance while in utero and/or after birth
<b>Trauma</b>	64% of the children were reported as experiencing at least one type of trauma. 67% of the children in the family, who are not focal children also experienced at least 1 trauma in their life.
<b>Development/Sensory Processing</b>	Deficits in Communication and Problems solving seem to get worse as the child's age increases. This demonstrates that deficits may not be seen right away if a child has been effected by drugs in utero or in the home environment.
<b>Mental Health</b>	Most of the children are not showing significant mental health issues. This varies for each case and may be due to the young age of the children.
<b>Living Situation and Stability</b>	On 08-06-2020, 49 focal children were reviewed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 49 of the children were in a home-like setting.</li> <li>• 15 with Mom</li> <li>• 7 with both parents</li> <li>• 25 were with kinship</li> <li>• 2 were in foster care</li> </ul> 1 child was able to be reunited with their biological mother. 2 children were able to be reunited with both biological parents
<b>Services</b>	Referrals were also made to medical services, including Birth to Three and eye doctors and education services.
<b>Number of Children Served in the Family including Focal Child</b>	139 Children
