## MARSHALL UNIVERSITY Licensure Program in Deaf and Hard of Hearing Education

Marshall University, with support provided by the West Virginia Department of Education and the West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and Blind, is offering a 30 semester-hour certification program for the education of children who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing. This program leads to licensure (pre-K– Adult) by the West Virginia Department of Education in teaching the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

Upon completion of this program, students will have acquired skills in accordance with the Council for Exceptional Children Standards for serving individuals who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing.

All program credit hours will allow teachers to enroll for credit at Marshall University with the assurance the licensure coursework may be incorporated into a 36 semester-hour Masters of Arts Degree in Special Education.

## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

To be considered for admission as a degree or professional development student, applicants must submit the following information to the Marshall University South Charleston Campus Office of Admissions and Records:

- A completed application for Graduate Admissions form and application fee;
- Official copies of all undergraduate and graduate transcripts (undergraduate GPA of 2.5 required)
- Meet one of the following two requirements:
  1. Score a total of 286 on the GRE OR
  2. Earn a raw score of at least 30 or a scaled score of
  - 2. Earn a raw score of at least 30 or a scaled score of 378 on the MAT
- All applicants must hold a valid WV general education teaching license prior to program admission.

\*GRE/MAT score requirement waived for applicants holding a masters degree.

Using both distance education delivery and "live" meetings, the courses will maximize learning opportunities while being convenient for students. Classes will have a specific number of "live" sessions each semester at a central location with continued support provided through internet-based learning opportunities.
