Thank you for your interest in the Adult and Continuing Education program (ACE)!

The online Master of Science degree program in ACE is a field-based program designed to serve adult learners who may be employed on a full-time basis. Students learn to build educational programs through the comprehensive online program and engage with other adult learners using various collaboration formats.

Once completed, graduates will be prepared to work in a variety of fields, such as Adult basic education, Adult advanced education, Community college instruction, University instruction, Career and technical instruction, Business, industry, and corporate training, Athletics coaching, Healthcare education, Community centers, Non-Profit organizations, or professional roles in Human resource services, Government agencies, Community agencies, and other fields that involve adult education and adult learning.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants should follow the admissions process described in this catalog or at the Graduate Admissions website: <http://www.marshall.edu/graduate/programs/how-to-apply-for-admission/>. In addition to Marshall University's requirements for admission, admission to the Adult Education and Evaluation emphasis is open only to students in good academic standing who have received a four-year Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher learning, and have a minimum undergraduate cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

A total of 30 credit hours is required for program completion for the Adult Education and Evaluation area of emphasis. A total of 33 credit hours is required for program completion for the Career and Technical Center Teaching area of emphasis. Upon completion of the program, students will earn a Master of Science degree in Adult & Continuing Education. Students must maintain a cumulative graduate GPA of 3.0 (B) in order to graduate from the program. During their final semester, students must prepare an academic portfolio in the Capstone course.
