Masks are required for all graduates and guests at all times.

No tickets are required for guest entrance and there is no limit on guests.

The Commencement ceremony will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. Doors will open at 8:00 a.m. **Please allow additional time for required security procedures in place at Mountain Health Arena.** Graduates must arrive **one hour before the ceremony.** 

# **COMMENCEMENT ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS 3 PM CEREMONY**

The Commencement ceremony will begin promptly at 3:00 p.m. Doors will open at 1:00 p.m. **Please allow additional time for required security procedures in place at Mountain Health Arena.** Graduates must arrive <u>one hour before the ceremony</u>.

# **GENERAL COMMENCEMENT ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS**

It is imperative for you to arrive on time and not be late. If you arrive after the processional begins, you will not be permitted to participate in the ceremony, unless there is extra seating available in a section designated for late arrivals. We cannot emphasize enough how important and essential it is that you arrive on time.

There is no secure area to leave personal possessions (purses, keys, cell phones, jackets, cameras, etc.). **Please leave personal possessions with guests until after the ceremony**. Items brought to the arena must remain with graduates at all times. Please wear comfortable shoes as graduates will be standing and walking on hard surfaces.

Once you arrive at the designated space in the arena concourse, staff will distribute name cards and direct graduates to their section on the Arena floor.

# **Doctoral Degrees**

It is the custom of Marshall University to individually recognize graduates of doctoral programs at Commencement.

For conferring of degrees, Dean of the College of Education and Professional Development, Dr. Teresa Eagle, will present the EdD candidates; Assistant Provost Dr. Carl Mummert will present the PhD candidates; and Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, Dr. Robert B. Bookwalter will present the PsyD candidates. Degrees are conferred by President Gilbert.

# **Undergraduate and Graduate Degrees**

Women wear academic caps throughout the entire ceremony. Men remove academic caps at the singing of the National Anthem and replace them when the college dean rises to present the class. **Master's Degree candidates wear academic hoods throughout the ceremony.** Academic caps must be worn for conferring of degrees. The tassel should initially be over the right eye for undergraduate students. Master's degree students should have the tassel over the left eye for the entire ceremony. Faculty marshals will direct graduates to be presented for individual recognition. Each graduate will hand his/her name card to the reader and proceed across the platform in front of the stage. A photographer will take two photographs of each graduate. After crossing the stage, graduates will exit the arena.

**Note regarding academic honors:** Honor graduates receiving Bachelor or Associate Degrees wear cords and matching tassels. Bachelor honor graduates wear green and white for Summa Cum Laude, gold for Magna Cum Laude and red for Cum Laude. Associate Degree honor graduates wear royal blue cords and tassels. Tentative December graduates are advised to verify honors eligibility with the Academic Dean's Office. Honor cords and tassels must be picked up in the Registrar's Office by 5:00 p.m. Friday, December 10th. Cords and tassels are to be kept by graduates.

# **CLASS OF 2021 COINS**

Four years ago, President Gilbert gifted the Marshall University Class of 2021 with a class coin during Week of Welcome. At the end of Freshman Convocation, President Gilbert challenged you to complete your degree in four years and to bring your coin when you cross the stage during your graduation ceremony. You are the very first class to celebrate with a commemorative coin and so we ask if you still have your coin, please bring it to commencement and proudly show it to President Gilbert when you shake his hand. Congratulations, Class of 2021!

Please note, the University does not have additional coins for those who may have lost them.

Accommodations for hearing impaired graduates and/or guests will be provided by a sign language interpreter.

#### **MILITARY SERVICE RECOGNITION**

Marshall University will recognize graduates with military service by issuing a special red, white and blue cord to be worn at Commencement. We pay respect and publicly recognize members of the United States armed forces and graduates of the ROTC program at Commencement by awarding this symbol of service. Military recognition cords must be picked up in the Registrar's Office by 5:00 p.m. Friday, December 10th.
