**WALDEN** is renowned for his work in **CLINICAL TROPICAL MEDICINE** and has collaborated internationally to improve health care delivery to rural and isolated tribes. He is the recipient of the Theodore Roosevelt Distinguished Service Medal and author of numerous publications including, *Jungle Travel and Survival*.
